

In the midst of dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and with the vaccine now available, folks may ask if this is a good time to move to a senior community. The answer is **YES**.

If you are not certain that this is the time, picture what winter looked like for you this past year. The summer and autumn provided safe outdoor opportunities, but likely those times ended as the winter weather settled in. Most of us became socially isolated as a result of COVD-19, with our routine activities canceled, our favorite restaurants temporarily closed, and general uneasiness about being in public. However, senior communities have amenities that will help residents get through these pandemic times.

Some of those amenities include the availability of meals as well as activities that enable virtual or socially distanced visitation. Strict infection control policies are in place. Common areas like lobbies, elevators, hallways and mail areas are being sanitized. All of the staff members are trained to follow best practices to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and are being screened before (and after) each shift for symptoms of the virus. Many of the staff have received vaccinations. They are obligated not to come to work when they are sick. Staff in the care centers are tested on a regular basis according to the PA Department of Health guidelines.

In addition to the issues of safety and socialization, senior communities may offer predictable financial stability and freedom from tasks that have become bothersome. There is no need to worry about taking care of a home or what the value will be when you want to sell. The current real estate market in your area may be strong for sellers, but the future of the market is hard to predict. Imagine how nice (and safe) it would be not to have to shovel or plow snow.

So, the answer is **YES**. Moving to a senior community can provide multiple benefits in a very doubtful time.

May 2021 be a year of renewed friendships and healthy social environments.

Ask The CEO

At Allegheny Lutheran Social Ministries (ALSM), we communicate with our staff team, our donors, our board, and persons we serve through a number of newsletters, emails, FACEBOOK, and alsm.org. Below are answers to a few questions I've recently heard asked about practices at ALSM.

Q: What can I do to support ALSM?

A: There are many ways in which to support ALSM. Thanks to generous individuals like you, ALSM can provide more than \$2 million in benevolent care each year to people who have outlived their funds. The year 2020 was a difficult one for all of us. It not only created emotional stress for everyone but also financial stress. In addition to the benevolent care need, the cost of personal protective equipment (PPE) to keep our residents, clients, and staff safe far exceeded \$100,000 in unbudgeted funds.

Below are a few suggestions on how to provide assistance:

- Make a gift to the PPE appeal or a specific community or program of ALSM by mail to 998 Logan Blvd., Altoona, PA 16602.
- Donate online by visiting www.alsm.org/donate.
- Plan your gift through annuities, IRA charitable contributions, or bequests.
- Donate a portion of the stimulus monies you received.

Moving into a senior living community can be stressful enough. Combine that major life change with the stressors of a global pandemic, and such a move might seem like an impossible task. But whatever the challenges are, Allegheny Lutheran Social Ministries' staff works tirelessly to provide as safe and seamless.

Take Ann Harpster for example. After she was hospitalized, it was necessary that Ann move into a personal care community. For Ann, there was no question about where she wanted to go – The Oaks at Pleasant Gap, where she had served on the Auxiliary Board of Directors

and as a volunteer. Ann says that her move to The Manor at The Oaks at Pleasant Gap went smoothly and that the "staff here is excellent. My room is lovely, and I was able to bring furniture from my house."

During the past year, many others have also moved in to ALSM communitites. After a fall in his home, Jack and his daughter decided it was necessary for him to move into The Lutheran Home at Johnstown. He has lived in the area his entire life and his daughter lives nearby. "It's been wonderful. Everybody is so cordial and solicitous. They know you by name," he says, "and they make sure you have what you need."

Like Ann and Jack, many residents feel relieved that they no longer have to maintain a house,

plus take care of yard work and snow removal, which for retirees, can feel like a full-time job. And, although social activities have been modified because of the pandemic, residents are still able to engage with others and enjoy time among their peers. Living near and safely

socializing with other residents lifts spirits and provides a sense of well-being and peace of mind.

Residents can rest assured that safety has been, and continues to be, a primary concern to ALSM staff team members during the global pandemic. Throughout, they have continued to safely provide the best care for all residents, new and old alike. At

the pandemic's outset, ALSM team members were quick to put in place enhanced cleaning and infection control measures. Personal protective equipment and social distancing are top priorities, and the COVID vaccine was made available early on to all residents and staff alike.

Now more than ever, older adults are choosing to live in communities like The Oaks at Pleasant Gap and The Lutheran Home, where accomodations are available for a variety of lifestyles and needs, from meal plan choices to on-site therapy.

As summer unfolds, ALSM looks forward to offering new residents a safe and healthy place to live and live fully.

Because of Covid-19 guidelines, residents of the cottages at The Oaks at Pleasant Gap were unable to access the library in the main building. In addition, the Centre County Book Mobile had broken down and was not able to serve the community.

One day while Mary Addis and Eleanor Myers were sitting in one of their garages chatting, this topic came up. Mary mentioned that her former neighborhood in Bellefonte had established a free library, essentially a free-standing box that held books for anyone to borrow and enjoy.

Eleanor, who had taken over the coordination of The Oaks' library a year earlier, immediately perked up. From that moment, the idea for a library box at The Oaks was put into motion. Cathy Mulberger joined the effort and the duo became a trio.

After an initial conversation with administrator Nichole Walker, they were given the green light, and in the ensuing weeks, they did research and identified the best location for such a box.


A local craftsman was found, and a box was constructed. The funds for the construction came from The Oaks Auxiliary Board.

In early November, the library box was installed on the cul-de-sac at the end of Colby Circle. This location is easily accessible for anyone walking the path or from their car.

Eleanor reports that there are nearly forty books currently in the box. All of them have come from Eleanor's extensive collection, and she is happy to share them. There is a range of books from novels to mysteries.


A place for everything and everything in its place.


We began a new chapter this year in our fight against COVID-19 with vaccination clinics for staff team members and residents.

After their first round of the Covid-19 vaccine, their personal messages say it all.
















YOUR GIFT MAKES AN IMPACT


