


Pre-K Counts

PRE-K COUNTS EXPECTED OUTCOMES





- Children build fine and gross motor skills through learning games and activities
- Children develop and refine self-help skills to help them be self-reliant and independent
- Children learn science concepts (such as needs of living things; weather; animals: magnets: etc.)
- Children develop mathematical thinking skills to help with counting, number recognition, understanding quantity and using simple functions like addition and subtraction.

Children learn creative expression through art, storytelling, construction, dramatic play, etc.
